Project Rebuild

Friends Foundation to Raise \$1.1 Million to Address Gaps in Hands-on Learning and Support the Retention, Recruitment, and Education of Medical Staff

Hands-on learning is fundamental in many workplaces, and Horizon's The Moncton Hospital (TMH) is no different—**especially when lives can be saved.**

The Friends of The Moncton Hospital Foundation wants to ensure our team can do just that by **investing in advanced equipment and innovative technology for two healthcare simulation spaces.**

These Simulation Labs (Sim Labs) will be designed to allow our healthcare providers to practise and hone their skills through real-life scenarios on life-like, computerized “smart mannequins”.

Simulationist Dr. Angus MacDonald says a Sim Lab and its many benefits touches us all, as both patients and providers. “It affects every discipline and reaches every inch of our hospital. It can even help us recruit and retain healthcare professionals, including physicians and nurses,” remarks Dr. MacDonald.

Two modern Sim Labs at TMH will allow our healthcare team to have the appropriate space to practise communication, teamwork, and skills we use to treat sick patients—everything from routine procedures to delivering babies, to life-saving procedures and surgery—ultimately saving lives.

Although the smart mannequins may not be real, the lessons learned and lives saved will be.

The Foundation's vision is to raise \$1.1 Million:

- **\$850,000** for equipment and technology for **two Sim Labs** at TMH
- **\$250,000** to create an **endowment to support the retention, recruitment, and education of medical staff**

Creating an Endowment

The second aim of **Project Rebuild** is to create an endowment to support the retention, recruitment, and education of medical staff. Foundation Board Chair Ryan Dillon says this endowment would continue to grow over time and support our medical system's human resource needs. "We are delighted that our first project is funding three scholarships per year for family doctors, on the condition that they practise in Greater Moncton upon graduation," offered Dillon. Over time, **Project Rebuild** has the potential to provide thousands of patients in our region with a family doctor. We have learned that when medical staff get their start here, they often stay. 🍃

If you have been to Horizon's The Moncton Hospital lately, you may have noticed a few new faces and positive changes underway.

Improving our processes within the Emergency Department and improving patient flow are our highest priorities right now. We are working on delivering earlier patient discharge times and the ability to discharge patients over the weekends, improving the average length of stay of patients, collaboration with our partners to ensure patients get access to the best level of care as soon as possible, addressing communication gaps, and working with expert consultants on improved processes to reduce wait times in the Emergency Department and flow in our Family Medicine units.

We are also addressing staffing challenges with a significant increase in recruitment resources and efforts, especially for recruiting nurses, which has led to several positive results already. I'm excited to share that since April 1, 2022, 47 internationally educated Nurses, 24 newly graduated Registered Nurses and 26 new Licensed Practical Nurse graduates were hired here at The Moncton Hospital.

In addition, 63 nursing students were hired this summer in support roles—42 Bachelor of Nursing students and 21 Practical Nurse students. We hope to have them in permanent positions after they graduate, too!

There is still a lot of work to be done and the challenges we face are not easy, but we are well on our way to improved efficiencies for patients and better work-life balance for all of our healthcare workers.

30-Year Survivor Celebrates with Campaign Donation

Here is Carol Estey's Story

On November 20, 1992, nobody was more surprised than I was to be told by my surgeon that a spot we had watched without concern for the last five years was malignant. I HAD BREAST CANCER!

Fast forward to 2022, and I've been very fortunate to call myself a breast cancer survivor for coming up on 30 years.

My husband and I downsized from Fredericton via Miramichi to Moncton three years ago. As giving was always important in our family, we began to look for places in our "new city" where we felt we could make a difference.

The goals of the Friends of The Moncton Hospital Foundation and their 2021-2022 campaign, to upgrade mammography screening equipment, fit that bill perfectly. To have advanced equipment

that can improve breast cancer detection and diagnosis is so important; and my husband and I agreed: what better way to show our gratitude for my being a 30-year survivor than to support that campaign!

The next step was to talk to our financial advisor. We had previously discussed the various methods by which we could achieve our giving goals and it was obvious to us that the best (and as it turns out, the easiest) way would be to make the donation directly from our financial portfolio. Not only would the chosen securities pass full value to the Foundation, we would also be able to avoid the capital gains and subsequent taxation that would have been triggered if we had just liquidated them.

Once we decided the amount and the specific securities, it was as simple as having our financial people talk to the

State-of-the Art Obstetrics and Newborn Care Coming Soon! \$4 Million Donor Contribution; \$35 Million from Provincial Government

The new build at The Moncton Hospital—Obstetrics and Newborn Care—is progressing well, with anticipated completion in June of 2023.

As part of the Women & Children's Health Program, Obstetrics and Newborn Care will include Neonatal ICU; Labour & Birth and Obstetrics combined care (antepartum/postpartum care) as well as all clinics associated with these areas of care; Maternal Fetal Medicine; Breastfeeding; and Postpartum Discharge clinics.

This project will revolutionize the way care is delivered, and provide patients, clients, staff and physicians with state-of-the-art technology in a space equipped to provide safe and quality care.

Friends Foundation Exceeds Goal

Enabling Purchase of Third Unit to Help with the Early Detection of Breast Cancer

In October 2022, the Friends of The Moncton Hospital Foundation set out to raise \$1.1 Million for two 3D Mammography Screening Units for the Katherine Wright Centre (KWC) to help with the early detection of breast cancer. The Foundation is very fortunate that Master Packaging graciously donated \$550,000 towards the cost of one of the Screening Units. “For over 25 years, we have supported community organizations where our employees live and work,” said Mary-Jean Irving, CEO of Master Packaging.

“The 3D Mammography Screening Units will continue to advance women’s healthcare and help provide early detection for breast cancer. On behalf of our employees, we are thrilled to donate to this much-needed campaign.”

“As a breast cancer survivor, I want to ensure women of Southeast New Brunswick have access to the best breast care possible,” remarked Ms. Irving. “This cause is important to our employees and one we are all pleased to support.”

With over \$1.5 Million raised, The Moncton Hospital (TMH) can now purchase the third required 3D Diagnostic Unit desperately needed. This will allow for a complete transition from a conventional (2D Image) to Digital Breast Tomosynthesis (3D image) technology for all patients undergoing breast imaging. The purchase of the Diagnostic Unit will bring contrast-enhanced mammography to patients at TMH much sooner than originally anticipated. This new

development in breast imaging involves administration of a special dye intravenously, which makes areas of particular concern stand out on the mammogram. These cutting-edge imaging tools will result in more accurate diagnoses, reducing the need for follow-up visits, decreasing unnecessary biopsies, enhancing critical information required by breast surgeons, and speeding up the overall diagnostic process, improving breast cancer detection and diagnosis for all patients.

Greg King, Friends’ President and CEO, is excited that the community has decided to elevate the standard of care in breast cancer detection.

“Special thanks to our radiologists, who kicked off that campaign with \$50,000

and to the entire community who donated. In addition, CIBC recently provided a generous \$150,000 gift. With the community's support and the inspirational Master Packaging gift, we now have enough money and the power to do something extraordinary for the women in our lives," said King.

Dr. Jean-Pierre Martel, Radiologist and Co-Clinical Department Head at TMH, says this state-of-the-art technology is a game-changer, allowing for superior imaging and more confident assessment of breast abnormalities at an earlier stage, ultimately saving lives. "Detecting and treating cancer earlier, before it has spread, is one of the most impactful ways to decrease mortality. The addition of contrast-enhanced mammography, made possible by the purchase of the third unit, will allow us to further up our game and provide truly sophisticated care for our patients." The current two Screening Units located in the KWC, and the Diagnostic Unit located in Medical Imaging, were purchased by the Foundation in 2008. Over 10,000 patients are screened at the KWC annually, while an additional 3,200 exams are performed at TMH's Diagnostic Imaging Department.

Campaign Chair, Ryan Dillon, says our donors and campaign volunteers can feel good that they are part of advancing breast cancer screening at TMH. "In our community, virtually everyone knows someone who has received the results of their mammogram and heard the unsettling news that they are now battling breast cancer. It is comforting to know our hospital will soon be able to offer more modern breast imaging technology," stated Dillon.

The screening units are due to be on site and operational in early 2023. 🌱

Comfort Boxes Tell Grieving Parents They are Not Alone

It may feel impossible to comfort grieving parents who have lost their baby, but you still have to do something.

That's why Moncton's Layla Michaels has created something called Comfort Boxes, which are filled with carefully thought out items to help families deal with their grief.

Layla knows there is nothing that could ever go in a box that could replace bringing your baby home from the hospital. Instead, the point of giving the boxes to parents is "to let them know they're not alone."

Layla and her husband Adam Lund know this loss. Their son Ryker was born just 27 weeks into Layla's pregnancy at The Moncton Hospital in January 2020. He died there just four days later.

On Ryker's first birthday, the couple made a donation of books to the hospital. Five months after that, on Bereaved Mother's Day, Layla created Big Hearts Little Stars to help other families facing this loss.

What is in a comfort box?

Depending on the circumstances, there are books on grieving and coping, tailored specifically to mothers and fathers, she says, noting fathers too often don't have their grief recognized. If needed, there are also various age-appropriate books to help any siblings work through their feelings.

A stuffed toy, an Angel Bear, is in the box with a space on its chest where the child's name can be embroidered.

"You leave the hospital without your baby, you need something to hold onto," Layla says.

The bear comes wrapped in a blanket made from material Layla sourced to be as close as possible to the blankets used in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. There is also a special memorial candle with a place on it for the child's name, handcrafted by an artisan in Campbellton. As well, there is a hand and footprint kit, a plain notebook for keeping a journal, and a bilingual pamphlet of special resources for those suffering the death of an infant. Lastly, a set of four cards called "Letters of Love" is included to help families through

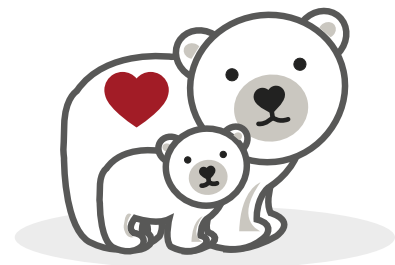
difficult times like Christmas or birthdays, complete with prompts for writing.

Tragically, roughly half of the 100 boxes created for The Moncton Hospital have already been given out to parents who have suffered the death of a child or pregnancy loss.

While there are plans to expand the program to other places, Layla says launching the initiative at The Moncton Hospital was the obvious starting point. "We had such a positive experience there, regardless of the tragic outcome," Layla says. "We wanted to give back."

"I spent two weeks on bed rest in Labour & Delivery (before Ryker was born). It quite honestly felt like home to me," she says.

"That's the only place where my son took breath." 🍃

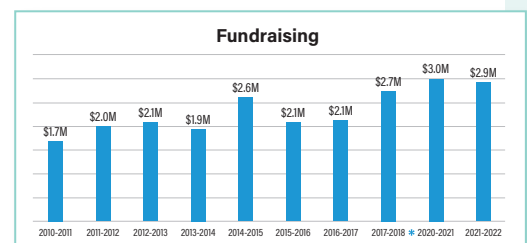

COVID-19 Care Fund Where did the money go?

Donor Funded Project Update

A new building containing Coronary Care Unit and Coronary/Step-Down Unit

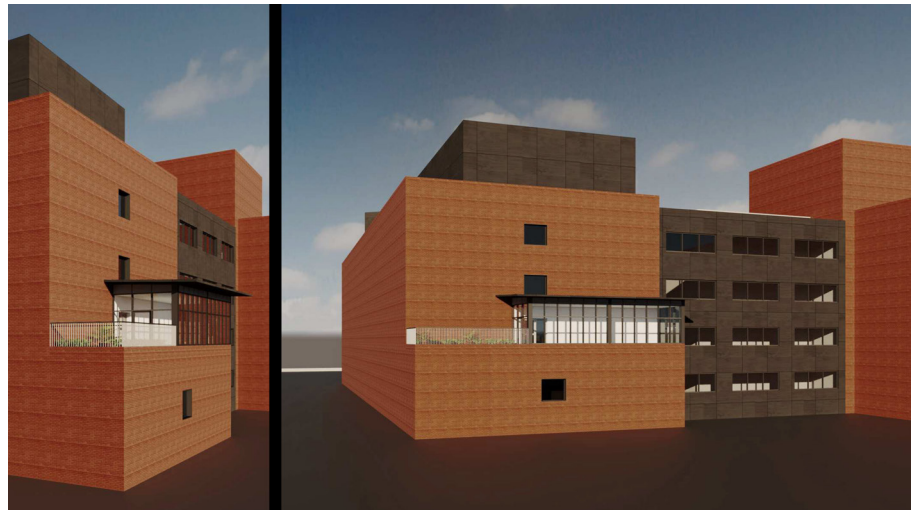
The hospital's two Inpatient Cardiology units will be relocating to a larger, inter-related space. This will result in more spacious, brighter, ventilated and modern units. They will be adjacent to one another to allow medical professionals the ability to provide more seamless care to patients. This improved space will also offer greater comfort and privacy for patients and their families, private washrooms for each room and best practice standards for infection control.

STATUS Construction is expected to begin in spring of 2023.

The Endobronchial Ultrasound (EBUS) is fully operational in Clinic E. The EBUS is a highly effective, minimally invasive diagnostic tool and the method of choice for respirologists and thoracic surgeons to accurately diagnose pulmonary diseases. It allows patients to have their diagnostic procedure in the clinic. Without the EBUS, there is often a 2-3 hour surgery, followed by 5-6 days in hospital, and an 8-12 week recovery period. With the EBUS, patients are back home on the same day with a minor recovery. This tool also allows them to get their diagnosis faster. If you or your loved ones have ever been waiting for a potential cancer diagnosis, you know how critical it is to shorten the time it takes.

Rhys' Run! is Cruising for a Cause

In the 10 years since William “Rhys” Perry’s birth and death, Rhys’ Run!, an annual car cruise in his memory, has raised a whopping \$80,000 to help other babies and their parents at The Moncton Hospital.

The event is always held the weekend before Thanksgiving and as it happens last year’s date, October 2, coincided with National Get Out N Drive Day. Yes, that’s a thing. And as great as that sounds for any car enthusiast across Canada, nowhere will getting out for a drive through the country mean as much as it does for the participants in Rhys’ Run.

Rhys’ parents, Christopher Perry and Bronwyn Doherty-Perry, admit they didn’t quite know what to do after he was born June 30, 2012, and died just four days later.

The couple didn’t have a funeral right away, but eventually decided they would have a celebration of life around the Thanksgiving weekend that year, when Rhys was supposed to have been born.

After the funeral, they decided to take a drive through the countryside around Cornhill and into Albert County, as cars and cruising are a passion shared on both sides of their family.

It was on that impromptu ride—just seven cars carrying family and close friends—that Rhys’ Run! was born.

“We asked our family to donate and that year it was \$1,500,” Christopher says.

The second year, 65 carloads of people took part, and the run has grown steadily since. In 2019, before the COVID pandemic interrupted the run, they had more than 200 cars and 400 people. Car people. Caring people. People who have suffered their own losses of children.

While nothing compares to the community of love and support Rhys’ Run! has built, it has also been about raising funds to help other parents and their babies at The Moncton Hospital.

In fact, when Bronwyn was expecting Rhys’ younger brother, she spent a significant length of time at the

hospital so her pregnancy could be carefully monitored. Ultimately, mother and baby Declan were fine, but Bronwyn and Christopher got to take advantage of some of the amenities those funds have helped pay for over the years.

Bronwyn and Christopher admit that organizing the annual cruise, and the corn boil and barbecue that are a part of it, is a lot of work, but it’s a labour of love.

What would Rhys say if he were here to see his run? “He’d probably tell us we’re crazy,” Bronwyn says, “but you have to have an outlet.” 🍃

\$235K Digital Slide Scanner Already Making an Impact

Dr. Muhammad Rasul, Hematopathologist at The Moncton Hospital (TMH), knows all too well the critical importance of having access to an advanced Digital Slide Scanner. In fact, when he trained in New York University (NYU), NY, this was the technology he was using.

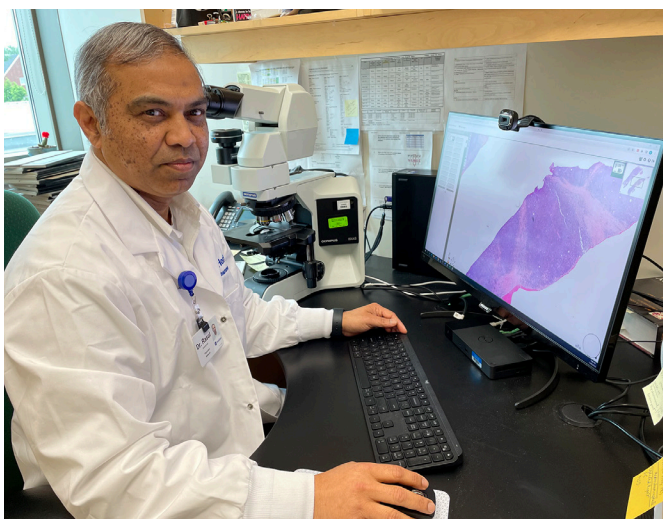
“I was delighted to learn that TMH was the first and only hospital lab in New Brunswick to have this device, and I am very happy to have this technology to assist me in diagnosing many types of diseases, such as cancer,” says Dr. Rasul.

This slide scanner allows for a high-quality digital picture of patient samples, which can be shared within Horizon Health Network instantly. A faster turnaround time is critical to expedite a patient’s treatment, improve patient care, and potentially save lives. As a recent development, we can now use this technology from anywhere outside the Horizon Health Network. This has already made a positive impact in our patient care.

“Recently, I tried this while attending a Medical Society meeting in Fredericton, where I was able to easily access an urgent patient’s specimen. It worked perfectly. I was able to make a quick diagnosis of a lymphoma in the break time between meetings. In this circumstance, time made a big difference in terms of the patient’s care.”

In the past, physicians needed to be physically present in the hospital to review the specimens. Now, it is possible to analyze remotely from anywhere at any time.

TMH was the first and only hospital lab in New Brunswick to have this device.

“I am hoping in the near future, all the specimens needed to be consulted at TMH could be accessed promptly using the digital scanner even before sending the specimen physically. This will eliminate the risk of losing slides during transport, reduce time and courier cost, and improve the patient’s care in giving the critical diagnosis in real time.”

Dr. Muhammad Rasul assures us that complete privacy is maintained. “We treat each slide as a patient.”

Every pathology diagnosis, from cancer to Crohn’s disease, is made by a Pathologist looking at patient samples. This device, which costs \$235,000, was entirely funded by the NB Doctors Cycling Against Cancer Ride. 🍃

“My Parents’ Passion was Helping People.”

Memorials Gift for Sharon Rubin Earmarked for Oncology Clinic Named after her Husband

It’s been a tough few years for Gabrielle Rubin who in 2018 lost her dad—Dr. Sheldon H. Rubin—a trailblazing doctor who was New Brunswick’s first oncologist and, more recently, her beloved mom Sharon, who passed away in August.

“My father dedicated his life to his patients and profession at The Moncton Hospital where he practised for 46 years. And because helping people was his passion, it was also my mother’s passion.” Gabrielle remembers that one of her mother’s proudest moments was the opening of The Dr. Sheldon H. Rubin Oncology Clinic in 2016. Just a few years later, Sharon herself was diagnosed with cancer and received treatment from the oncology clinic where her daughter says she “felt like a queen.”

“My mother was so grateful to the doctors, nurses and staff at the clinic for their tireless care, kindness and compassion,” remarks Gabrielle.

My parents were donors to the Friends of The Moncton Hospital Foundation for over 30 years, so it was a great honour to ask our friends and family to provide a memorial donation to give back to the place where he spent much of his life, and where my mother spent her last days. 🌿
